Dear Ms. Cange:

In accordance with Chapter XI of the Federal Facilities Agreement (FFA) between the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Department of Energy (DOE), EPA has reviewed DOE's Post-Remedial Action Reports and Independent Radiological Verification Surveys to determine whether the documentation provided in those reports is consistent with that required by the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA), the National Contigency Plan (NCP), and Superfund guidance and policy.

We concur with DOE's conclusions presented in the above reports - that contamination as defined in the earlier radiological surveys (1981-1984) was successfully removed from the affected properties. However, while remediation of the Ballod property (south of the railroad spur) appears to have been successful under then existing criteria, gamma radiation exposure measurements at three locations slightly exceeded the current 100 mRem/year criteria prior to backfilling. The use of clean backfill may have reduced these values to below 100 mRem/year. However, to confirm that the 100 mRem criteria is not being exceeded, we recommend that follow-up measurements be conducted at those locations.
