MAYWOOD SITE - REQUEST FOR WITHDRAWAL OF NJDEPES EMERGENCY PERMIT NO. NJ0054500

This letter is in response to your recent inquiry regarding the application for discharge to surface water submitted by the Department of Energy (DOE) for the Maywood Interim Storage Site (MISS) on July 15, 1985. The MISS is a DOE-owned facility located in Bergen County, New Jersey. The Maywood site, which includes MISS, was placed on the National Priorities List on September 8, 1983. The site is currently being remediated under federal Superfund program authority.

The application in question was filed at the request of NJDEP following departmental review of DOE's work plan for the construction of an interim storage pile for soil removed from properties that are part of the Maywood site. The application was for the discharge of truck washwater, storage pile leachate, and stormwater runoff from pile construction activities. On August 20, 1985, NJDEPE responded by letter that the application was administratively complete and had been forwarded to the Bureau of Industrial Discharge Permits for technical review.

Since construction of the pile was completed in 1985, and because wastewater from pile construction, leachate, and cleanup operations was containerized and disposed of by a licensed wastewater hauler, DOE respectfully requests withdrawal of the July 15, 1985, application. As an aside and for your information, leachate from the storage pile continues to be containerized and disposed of by a licensed waste hauler.
