I want to thank you for the cooperation you have afforded us throughout the planning period for the environmental cleanup work at your property. The planning has incorporated a lot of effort by many dedicated people, but none more important than you, the property owner. I realize that our work can be a disturbance, but I hope our interactions have been as pleasant as possible.

The Department of Energy has recently forwarded its schedule for the upcoming residential cleanups to the Tri-Borough and County Thorium Coalition, which includes representatives from the boroughs of Maywood and Lodi, and from Rochelle Park Township. Based on the Coalition's understanding of community concerns and priorities, the group has worked with DOE to lay out a sequence for the cleanups. Also driving the schedule are several engineering and geographic considerations that are critical to the long-term success of the cleanup. The sequence of cleanups has been carefully planned to ensure that once a property is addressed recontamination will not occur.

Under the proposed schedule, your property will be in the first group to be addressed as part of our residential work. Cleanup at your property will probably take place during fall of 1995, depending on funding and the pace of the work.

Following the cleanup, the property will be restored to the condition it was in prior to our work to the extent possible. You will also be issued a letter by DOE stating that the work is done and that your property is released with no radiological restrictions.

I want to thank you for the cooperation you have afforded us throughout the planning period for the environmental cleanup work at your property. The planning has incorporated a lot of effort by many dedicated people, but none more important than you, the property owner. I realize that our work can be a disturbance, but I hope our interactions have been as pleasant as possible.

The Department of Energy has recently forwarded its schedule for the upcoming residential cleanups to the Tri-Borough and County Thorium Coalition, which includes representatives from the boroughs of Maywood and Lodi, and from Rochelle Park Township. Based on the Coalition's understanding of community concerns and priorities, the group has worked with DOE to lay out a sequence for the cleanups. Also driving the schedule are several engineering and geographic considerations that are critical to the long-term success of the cleanup. The sequence of cleanups has been carefully planned to ensure that once a property is addressed, recontamination will not occur.

Under the proposed schedule, your property will be in the first group to be addressed as part of our residential work. Cleanup at your property will probably take place during summer of 1996, depending on funding and the pace of the work. We will schedule a meeting with you prior to cleanup to discuss detailed plans.

Following the cleanup, the property will be restored to the condition it was in prior to our work to the extent possible. You will also be issued a letter by DOE stating that the work is done and that your property is released with no radiological restrictions.

I have enclosed a drawing that depicts the areas on your property where we will need to concentrate our cleanup efforts. The drawing was generated using information we obtained in March when we came to your house to take soil samples. As you can see, the areas of contamination have been refined since the 1986 characterization effort. This refinement is based primarily on the data we collected in March which utilized more advanced radiation measurement technology.

If you wish to see an entire copy of the technical memorandum that contains the raw data collected during the March sampling effort, please give us a call at the local DOE Public Information Office at (201) 843-7466. Copies of the document are at the office, which is located at 55 West Pleasant Avenue in Maywood. The document is also part of the project's Administrative Record, which is housed at the Maywood Public Library on Maywood Avenue as well as at our Information Office.


