Please be advised that Commissioner Shinn has asked me to respond to your facsimile request of September 9, 1995 with regard to the referenced site. In that correspondence, you requested a clarification concerning the position that the State of New Jersey has taken relative to the cleanup of the Maywood site.

As you are aware, N.J.S.A 58:10B et. seq. (commonly referred to as S-1070) requires the establishment of both residential and nonresidential cleanup standards for those New Jersey properties involved in environmental remediation activities. Compliance with these New Jersey statutory requirements is the central focus of ongoing discussions with the United States Department of Energy (USDOE).

Removal of the contaminated soil pile is pivotal in the successful remediation of the Maywood Interim Site and has never been an issue. With reference to your assertions, the current New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) approved USDOE activities involving soil pile removal for offsite disposal do not constitute a New Jersey statute violation. Of course, the NJDEP will continue to inform the USDOE of its statutory obligations regarding all clean-up limits for the Maywood Interim Storage Site.
