4. PROJECT SCHEDULE

The USACE will direct a contractor to implement this removal action, who will prepare implementation plans for this removal. These plans will contain implementation schedules, once approved by the USACE. Assuming sufficient funding is available, the fieldwork for the implementation of this removal is expected to begin on or about November 15, 2001 and to take an estimated 12 to 18 months to complete.


5. ESTIMATED COSTS

Implementation of this removal action is estimated to cost approximately \$22 million. This estimate includes contractor services for plan and report preparation and for personnel involved in the implementation of the removal. This estimate also includes equipment, transportation and disposal costs. It does not include the USACE labor for contractor oversight and reporting. However, the USACE labor costs will not significantly increase this estimate.

V. APPROVAL OF REMOVAL ACTION

This Action Memorandum was developed in accordance with CERCLA and the NCP, and is based upon information contained in documents in the Administrative Record for this Removal Action.
